DEAR PARENTS/CUSTODIAN!

As you probably are well aware of, we must get better at managing the earth's resources. We all need to reduce our energy consumption, pollution and waste. But how? One easy way is to recycle beverage cartons. By recycling a milk carton for example, the paper content can become new cardboard, tissue paper or writing paper! Recycling is an easy way to save resources and reduce energy consumption.

Sweden is one of the best recycling nations in the world. But when it comes to recycling beverage cartons, we are actually below the European average. However, recycling of beverage cartons in Sweden has increased over the years the school competition "Kartongmatchen" has been running. Today, one third of all beverage cartons are recycled. So don't throw the cartons in the bin, recycle them!

The curriculum says that the schools shall take care of cultural heritage and work with different ways to prepare pupils for what is needed in a changing time. It's important to provide pupils with knowledge of the conditions for a healthy environment and sustainable development.

Kartongmatchen helps and inspires preschools and schools to work with environmental and sustainability issues by offering lots of educational support materials such as films, exercises, presentations and more. You will find inspiration and material at www.kartongmatchen.se. The last years we, Tetra Pak and WWF, have organized a major national competition, Kartongmatchen, involving children in preschool and comprehensive schools up to grade 6. A key component of the competition is to help recycle beverage cartons at home. The competition quickly became the most popular competition ever with, so far nearly 200 000 participating children. This years competition is running until the 8th of February 2019.

Some exercises involve the children's homes and you as a parent/custodian.
